The American way of war

It's a natural thing; whenever you stand up to be counted, you can always depend on someone to question your arithmetic. Honest debate, it's the American way and so it is with Glen Taylor who responded to my recent article "This is war, or is it?" He identifies himself as a "political science major" from the elitist Johns Hopkins University. I suppose I should be duly impressed, but as a minor liberal arts student from the obscure College of William and Mary, alma mater of Thomas Jefferson and James Monroe, for now, I'll just have to "think on it." Besides, I've forgotten most of what I learned there ... it was more than 45 years ago. Subsequently, I served 26 years in three military services; in Army olive drab, in Marine Corps green, and Navy blue. During which time I learned about duty, honor and what it means to put your life on the line for God and country.

My nemesis, obviously a liberal, points out that Republicans support unconstitutional "prayer in schools and the banning of abortion." While I don't pretend to speak for all Republicans, I will say he's partly right but, our liberal political science major might consider the flip side, it's not unconstitutional to refrain from killing unborn children in their mothers' wombs or within moments of taking their first breath. As for prayer in schools, it's not unconstitutional to pray

in school, it's only unconstitutional for the government to mandate it. Truth is NATO has never attacked a sovereign state run by communists, but when the Boy Wonder regards Serbia as a "right-wing dictatorship" NATO invades their sovereign borders. Mere sovereignty has been the basis of international law for over a thousand years. Today, we're giving away our national sovereignty and military resources to NATO;
